Joanna Kaczorowska

Dr. Joanna Kaczorowska is internationally acclaimed for her virtuosity and impeccable artistry and has performed as a soloist and in combination with today's leading artists including the Emerson String Quartet, Yo-Yo Ma, Itzhak Perlman, Michael Tilson Thomas and David Robertson. She has performed in every major concert hall, both here and abroad, including more than 30 concerts in Carnegie Hall, concerts in Suntory Hall in Tokyo, Beethoven-Haus in Germany, and at many major music festivals including Music at Menlo, Aspen, and Tanglewood. Joanna has won much acclaim and many prestigious prizes and awards at numerous international competitions, including First Prize in the 2009 Liszt-Garrison Festival & International Piano Competition. Recently, Joanna was invited to perform on a PBS television special with Dr. Brian Greene, noted physicist, best-selling author, and director of the World Science Festival, playing Bach's Chaconne as an integral part of Dr. Greene's show, *Light Falls: Space, Time, and an Obsession of Einstein* (now available on Audible). She is also a featured artist performing in both the opening and the main soundtrack of the critically acclaimed movie, *Four Journeys*, winner at many international film festivals. Joanna performed at the United Nations conference in New York, organized and presented by Dr. Stephen Post, in a session focused on Peace, Tolerance, and Human Rights. This event and performance were featured in Dr. Post's recent Amazon best-selling book "God and Love on Route 80: The Hidden Mystery of Human Connectedness." Kaczorowska has presented talks about mentorship, personal growth, inspiration, and achievement in many prestigious conferences including Renaissance Weekend and TEDxSBU. Joanna is the Director of performance and violin professor at Stony Brook University and for Carnegie Hall's Professional Training Workshops, a distinguished judge, and an avid advocate of bringing music to underserved communities. Stony Brook University honored Joanna by awarding her with the inaugural 40 Under Forty Alumni Award, honoring their brightest and most innovative alumni. Kaczorowska is a published journalist and art critic, as well as the founder and Artistic Director of New York Chamber Musicians. Her violin was made by Lukas Wronski.

Brad Drinkwater (Suffolk Senior Treble Choir) has been teaching music, including 7th through 12th grade mixed and treble voice choirs, for sixteen years. He presently teaches choir and music theory at Connetquot High School in Bohemia, where he also directs the Alumni Choir. Brad served as the pianist for the Suffolk Symphonic Choir from its inception in 2013 until his appointment as director of the Suffolk Senior Treble Choir in 2019. Under his direction, the Connetquot High School Concert Choir has appeared at American Choral Directors Association, New York State School Music Association, and New York State School Board Association conferences and won 2nd place in the choral performance category of the 2020 American Prize national performing arts competition. Brad was also recognized as a semifinalist for the 2021 Grammy Music Educator Award. Additionally, Connetquot's annual Choral Arts Day event was recognized by Music for All with an Advocacy in Action award. Brad received his bachelor's degree in Music Education, with dual concentrations in voice and piano, from New York University and later earned a Master of Arts degree from Teachers College, Columbia University. At NYU, he studied with David Elliott, Francisco Nuñez, and Deirdre O'Donohue and served as the Assistant Director and pianist for the NYU Children's Choir. He enjoys working as a conductor, singer, and collaborative pianist, performing throughout Long Island—including as a member of the eVoco Voice Collective. Most importantly, he shares his love of music with his wife, Lauren, and their two sons.

Shoshana Hershkowitz (Suffolk Symphonic Choir) holds degrees in music education and vocal performance from the Crane School of Music at SUNY Potsdam. She is an artist in residence at Stony Brook University, where she conducts the Stony Brook Chorale and Camerata Singers, and prepares choirs for the opera productions. Mrs. Hershkowitz recently joined the Crane School of Music faculty as an off-campus supervisor for Long Island music education student teachers. She is proud to be the founding conductor of MYO's Suffolk Symphonic Choir (formerly named the Suffolk Youth Chorale), which debuted in 2013. From 1999-2009, Mrs. Hershkowitz taught at Commack High School, where she directed mixed and women's choirs. As a guest conductor, Mrs. Hershkowitz has conducted choirs of all age levels for NYSSMA, Vermont American Choral Directors Association, Vermont Music Educators Association, Nassau Music Educators Association, Suffolk County Music Educators Association, Hamptons Music Educators Association, Three Village schools, and Eastern U.S. Music Camp. As a clinician, Mrs. Hershkowitz has presented workshops for NYSCAME, SCMEA, the Society for Ethics in Education, and the Balanced Mind Conference, as well as with school choirs and choral directors across Long Island. Mrs. Hershkowitz is a proud member of the eVoco Voice Collective, a semi-professional chamber choir. Mrs. Hershkowitz directed the MYO Tour Choir in Europe in the summer of 2018.

Craig B. Knapp (Suffolk Treble Choir) is a graduate of the Crane School of Music and has been teaching Classroom Music and Chorus, grades 3 through 5, in the Rocky Point School District since 1998. With his innovative and energetic approach to music education, Mr. Knapp directs The Metropolitan Youth Orchestra of New York's Treble Choirs for students in grades 4-6. Craig also directs the Stony Brook University Summer Youth Choir. Mr. Knapp is an Adjunct Assistant Professor at Hofstra University. He is also the director of the Early Childhood Community Music Program at Stony Brook University, where he instructs children in Pre-K through 6th grade. Craig is the co-author of the GIA published book, "First Steps in Music with Orff Schulwerk: Sing, Say, Dance, Play." Craig is a sought-after clinician and choral conductor and has guest conducted for the Connecticut Music Educators' Association Elementary Honors Choir, New Hampshire Music Educators' Association Elementary Honors Choir, Kodály Organization of New York "Voices United" Festival, Pennsylvania Music Educators' Association Elementary ChorusFest, and various All-County chorus groups throughout New York. Craig has presented elementary classroom music and choral workshops at various music education conferences, including national conferences for the National Association for Music Education, American Choral Directors Association, Organization of American Kodály Educators, American Orff Schulwerk Association and Feierabend Association for Music Education. Mr. Knapp is a Past-President of the Suffolk County Music Educators' Association and is actively involved with the New York State School Music Association, currently serving on their Curriculum Committee. Phil Preddice (Suffolk Principal Orchestra) is a graduate of the Crane School of Music where he studied viola with Lamar Alsop, Theodore Israel, and Maurice Baritaud. His conducting studies were carefully guided by Professor Brock McElheran. Performances under the batons of Eugene Ormandy, Stanley Chappel, Christopher Keene, and Aaron Copland inspired Mr. Preddice to reach for new heights as a conductor. He has been the conductor of the Suffolk Principal Orchestra since its formation in 2008. Mr. Preddice is the founding and Principal Conductor of the Crane School of Music Alumni Festival Orchestra. He is a composer, with several works premiered by the MYO Suffolk Principal Orchestra. Mr. Preddice frequently conducts State, and Regional Festival Orchestras. For many years, he worked as Principal Conductor of the New York State Summer School of the Arts String Orchestra in Saratoga. Mr. Preddice is a past President of the Suffolk County Music Educator's Association. Additionally, he has held Executive Board positions with the Long Island String Festival Association, and the New York State American String Teacher's Association. He is currently retired from a career as orchestra director in the Commack, Shoreham-Wading River, and Three Village school districts. Mr. Preddice is the recipient of the 2000 Helen Hosmer Excellence in Music Teaching Award, granted by the Alumni Association of the Crane School of Music at SUNY Potsdam.

Felicya Schwarzman (Suffolk String Orchestra) is the Orchestra and Guitar Director at Half Hollow Hills High School East. Over the course of her time at Half Hollow Hills, she founded the 3rd grade string program, the High School East Guitar Program, and Cello Choir. Felicya holds a Bachelor of Music Education from Ithaca College and a Master of Music Education with an Advanced Certificate in Bilingual/Bicultural Education from Teachers College, Columbia University. In 2021, she received the SCMEA Music Educator Innovator Award and her Guitar Ensemble was recognized in the Long Island Music Hall of Fame High School Recognition program. Felicya is the President Elect of NY-ASTA Chapter where she helped found the annual NY-ASTA CelloFest. Her experiences as a clinician include the SCMEA All County Festival, NYSSMA Summer Conference, and Universidad Sergio Arboleda. In these workshops, she discussed her passion for non-traditional methods of playing the cello and how to develop contemporary ensembles in public schools. She also serves her local community as a SCMEA Festival Chairperson. As a professional cellist and violinist, she performs in the South Shore Symphony Orchestra. In addition, she has adjudicated and coached the NY All State Symphony Orchestra Cello Section. Felicya's passion for music and language brought her to teach English through music in Italy at the Lombardy Montessori Bilingue School Summer Camp. She also volunteers for Musicians for the World and teaches private lessons in Spanish to students abroad who cannot afford lessons. Felicya is a proud alumna of MYO. She joined the MYO family as a violinist in 2007 and then as a cellist a year later. She started working behind the scenes as the MYO Summer Intern during college, then as the Cello Coach for the Nassau String and Concert Orchestras, and is thrilled to continue working with MYO's talented musicians.

Scott Zarchy (Suffolk Symphony Orchestra) is a music educator, cellist, and composer. Mr. Zarchy received undergraduate degrees in Cello Performance and Music Education from the Peabody Conservatory, where he also completed studies in composition. He received a Master of Music degree in Music Education from Boston University and a Master of Arts in Music Composition from Hunter College (CUNY). Mr. Zarchy studied the cello at Peabody with the late Mihaly Virizlay, 40-year Principal Cellist of the Baltimore Symphony, and Alan Stepansky, former Associate Principal of the New York Philharmonic. Mr. Zarchy also performed in master classes with cellists including Alisa Weilerstein, Natasha Brofsky, and Amit Peled. Mr. Zarchy was the founding conductor of the MYO Suffolk Concert Orchestra from its inception in 2009 until 2013, at which time he became the founding conductor of the Suffolk Symphony Orchestra. Mr. Zarchy has been the orchestra teacher, as well as pit orchestra and chamber orchestra director, at Patchogue-Medford High School since 2006, where his ensembles have regularly achieved NYSSMA Level VI Gold and Gold with Distinction ratings. Mr. Zarchy's public school conducting has spanned a wide range of genres, including extensive musical theater work, film music, combined choral/instrumental works and jazz, as well as more traditional classical repertoire. In addition, he is a former executive board member of LISFA and is an active member of the Long Island music education community, having given several workshops on string teaching at professional development conferences.
