<u>NOTE</u>

This custom tour to Spain for MYO is planned by GrandTours. All times printed in the itinerary are approximate and subject to final confirmation by your professional tour managers: *Nacho Piqueras, Rocío Pérez and Cristina Herrero*. The order of sightseeing outlined in this tour booklet can and will change due to traffic & weather, as well as changes in the sightseeing, rehearsal and concert schedule. Always be aware of the location for meeting the group, as well as exact times for sightseeing and musical activities as communicated by your guides. Shadow tour timings will at at times differ slightly and your tour manager will announce those to you. The tour manager will also assist with concert attendance and admission/seating for the group.

We will be using three deluxe 50-passenger motor coaches from *Elite Touring* throughout the entire tour. Two coaches will be used for MYO musicians and staff. The third coach will be for non-performing shadow tour travelers. Get to know your tour manager and driver as they are excellent professional resources while you are visiting Spain. Please take any personal belongings as well as trash with you when leaving the bus at the end of each day. During the day, your belongings are secure on the coach. Upon arrival at each listed hotel, you may wish to obtain a local city-map and highlight the location of the hotel. A complete list of hotels with contact information is contained in this tour booklet and we recommend you keep it with you while touring. This information may be helpful if you need to return to the hotel on foot or by local transportation.

AIRLINE BAGGAGE AND FEES

American and Iberia Airlines allow one checked piece of luggage—up to 50 lb. and 62 linear inches (L+W+H). We recommend taking no more than 40 lb. to save room for souvenirs you may wish to purchase during the tour. You can also bring one carry-on piece—up to 45 linear inches and 22 lb. We recommend choosing a carry-on bag the size of a school backpack. Musical instruments that can fit in the overhead bin or under your seat should be taken on-board as personal items. A maximum of two pieces are allowed in the aircraft cabin. Due to limited space on the motor coach, it is essential that you pack efficiently and save space for any souvenirs you wish to buy in Spain. AIR TRAVEL

The group will be flying on American and Iberia Airlines to and from Spain. Passengers were ticketed approximately 30-days before departure on group reservation numbers. Seats are generally assigned in alphabetical order within each reservation number. You will not be able to access your flight record online as you would with an individual ticket. Flight itineraries are included with your tour documents and the AA reservation number is included on the air itinerary. MYO representatives will assist with check-in at New York-JFK (Terminals 7&8). You may put your AAdvantage award number into the air record at the departure gate at JFK. Please review current baggage allowances and information at: www.iberia.com

PROTECTING VALUABLE ITEMS

The best way to protect and carry valuables such as a passport, boarding passes, debit and credit cards, and cash is to buy a zippered passport holder or a money belt. Either of these can be worn beneath clothing or attached to a belt. You may find them at stores such as Target & Walmart. Check with your insurance provider to make sure personal musical instruments are insured to full replacement value with your homeowner's policy.

LUGGAGE

All checked luggage must be unlocked unless you use a special TSA approved lock. Make sure you have your GrandTours luggage tags and personal identification attached to your bags. It is wise to also include identification inside your suitcase in case a tag is destroyed or removed. Do not pack items such as your money, passport, ticket receipts, or other travel documents. Lost or damaged luggage must be reported before you leave the airport. The airlines will not be responsible for unreported loss or damage. Check with your insurance provider to make sure personal instruments are insured to full replacement value with your homeowner's policy.

PASSPORT

All tour members are required to have a passport which must remain valid 6-months beyond the return date of the tour or January 19, 2017. Do not pack your passport in luggage, but keep it with you and available always. We strongly recommend that you keep a photocopy of your passport in your luggage in case you happen to lose your original.

3-1-1 GUIDELINES

All liquids, gels or aerosols in your carryon luggage must be in original containers of 3 ounces or less. All containers of liquids, gels and aerosols are to be placed in one quart-size clear plastic zip-top bag. One quart-size bag of liquids, gels and aerosols per traveler allowed in your carryon luggage. This bag must be removed from your luggage and placed in the security bin for x-ray screening at the security check point. Visit <u>www.tsa.gov</u> for further details.

US CUSTOMS

You can currently bring back into the United States \$800 of personal and household goods duty free. Anything above this amount and you will have to pay duty.

TIME DIFFERENCE

Spain will be 6-hours ahead of New York. When it is 9:00 AM in New York it will be 3:00 PM in Spain.

MEDICAL NEEDS

Special inoculations are not required to visit Spain. We encourage you to check with your physician as a precaution. Be sure to bring necessary medication with you on the trip. DO NOT pack medication in your checked luggage. We suggest you obtain a duplicate of your prescriptions and inhalers. Please inform the MYO Staff and Tour Nurse of any illness immediately.

WEATHER AND CLOTHING

The entire trip is casual so please dress for comfort. You can expect average daily temperatures to vary between 60-90° F over the course of the day. Your tour leaders will communicate proper performance attire. Use <u>www.weather.com</u> as a resource before departure.

COMMUNICATION

Most are using mobile phones with international plans now. We do not recommend dialing home from your hotel room as it is very expensive. You will need to check with your service provider if planning on using your mobile phone. Roaming voice and data charges can be very expensive and this deserves careful attention before departure. Be sure your mobile phone has a data or application switch if you plan on using it abroad. *Skype, Viber, What's App,* and other messaging apps on phones/tablets are a great way to communicate when in free WiFi areas.

ELECTRICITY

The electricity in Spain runs at 220 volts, 50 cycles. You will need to bring an adapter and converter to use a U.S. hair dryer, curling iron, razor, or travel iron. Some appliances can now accommodate both 110 and 220 volt current. Please review your device information before departure. Converter and adapter kits can be bought at Target, Walmart, REI, etc. Most U.S. made electronic devices such as laptops, I-pods, camera chargers are now dual voltage and only require a 2-prong European adapter plug.

FOREIGN CURRENCY

MONEY AND USE OF DEBIT/CREDIT CARDS

We recommend you bring a combination of cash and some type of debit & credit card for the tour that can be used in local ATM/ Bankomat machines. Check with your bank for any ATM or foreign transaction fees associated with your debit & credit card.

MasterCard and Visa and American Express is accepted in most restaurants and shops, but not in all locations. Local currency can be withdrawn from ATM Machines with cards on the Plus and Cirrus systems. You must have a 4-digit PIN for these cards to work. You generally receive the Interbank rate-of-exchange plus any foreign transaction fees (FTFs) associated with your individual card.

YOU MUST CALL YOUR BANK TO ADVISE THAT YOU WILL BE USING YOUR DEBIT OR CREDIT CARD IN SPAIN IT MAY BE DEACTIVATED FOR FRAUD PROTECTION.

SPENDING MONEY

While spending money is completely a personal matter, we find that most travelers are reviewing their budget for meals that are not included, snacks, and an amount for souvenirs. We find students are averaging \$200-\$400 in spending money on a tour of this nature.

GRATUITIES

All gratuities to your tour manager, drivers, and local guides have been included in the tour price. There is no need to do any additional tipping. You may leave some small change in the rooms for maids, but this is at your discretion.

TRAVEL GUARD PROTECTION PLAN

Each traveler has limited insurance coverage with Travel Guard's, Group Protection Plan. There is NO trip cancellation coverage provided as part of this policy. Once purchased, it becomes an individual policy with reimbursements the responsibility of the traveler.
