Doreen Fryling, Ed.D. (Nassau Concert Choir) is in her 27th year as a public school music educator. She currently teaches IB Music and chorus classes at South Side High School in Rockville Centre, NY, and has previously taught K-5 general music and middle school chorus. She teaches graduate courses in music education at Hofstra University in philosophy, research, and curriculum and instruction. Doreen is an active and founding member of the eVoco Voice Collective and served for 8 years on the board as the Special Projects Chair. Doreen has a Doctorate of Education in Learning and Teaching from Hofstra University. Her dissertation is on the psychological and sociological factors that influence persistence in choral singing. She also holds degrees from Susquehanna University and the University of Michigan. In 2015 Doreen was recognized as a semifinalist for the Grammy Music Educator Award. She has been published several times on the NAFME Music in a Minuet Blog and featured in their Member Spotlight Interviews. Doreen currently serves as President of NY-ACDA. Doreen shares her love of music making with her husband, David, and their two children.

Craig B. Knapp (Nassau Treble Choir) is the current Elementary Music Department Chairperson in the Rocky Point School District where he has been teaching Classroom Music and Chorus, grades 3 through 5, at the Joseph A. Edgar Intermediate School since 1998. A graduate of the Crane School of Music, Mr. Knapp has also studied with distinguished educators and musicians including John Feierabend, Jos Wuytack, Henry Leck, Francisco Núñez, Janet Galván, Will Schmid and Bobby McFerrin. Craig is an Adjunct Assistant Professor at Hofstra University where he teaches "Conversational Solfege" and "First Steps in Music with Orff Schulwerk." He is the co-author of the book, *First Steps in Music with Orff Schulwerk: Sing, Say, Dance, Play* and a contributing author for the book, *Feierabend Fundamentals: History, Philosophy, and Practice*. Craig is a sought-after clinician and choral conductor and has guest conducted for the Connecticut Music Educators' Association Elementary Honors Choir, New Hampshire Music Educators' Association Elementary Honors Choir, Ohio Music Educators' Association Elementary All-State Choir, KONY (Kodály Organization of New York) "Voices United" Festival and Pennsylvania Music Educators' Association Elementary ChorusFest. He has also guest conducted various All-County chorus groups in New York State for the Dutchess, Monroe, Nassau, Orange, Putnam, Rockland, Schoharie, Suffolk, and Ulster County Music Educators' Associations. Craig is actively involved with NYSSMA (New York State School Music Association), where he recently served on their Curriculum Committee and NYSSMA Manual Committee. Craig is the only educator to simultaneously hold Lifetime Memberships in ACDA, FAME and OAKE.

James Ludwig (Nassau Lower Voices) grew up singing as a chorister at the Cathedral of the Incarnation in Garden City on Long Island, where he learned to read music, sing Renaissance polyphony, tie a tie, and play ultimate frisbee. He currently teaches choral music in the Herricks School District on Long Island, where he works with both middle and high school singers, whose energy and sense of humor are truly a source of constant inspiration. Having been a singer himself throughout middle and high school, James believes choral music is especially valuable for young people. Like sports, it teaches teamwork, discipline, and practice; and like visual arts it exposes teens to creative expression that is not accessible through video games and smartphones. James is a member of the eVoco Voice Collective. He has served as guest conductor for district and county festivals and has presented workshops about ensemble classroom management and strategies for teaching middle school music at both all-state and regional conferences for NYSSMA, NYSCAME, and ACDA. His choral compositions are available through GIA, Hinshaw, and a self-published catalog. His works have been performed in the United States and Great Britain, including by eVoco, the FSU Choral Union, and the Phoenix Chorale under the direction of Charles Bruffy. He holds degrees from Queens College and Berklee College of Music. James is proud to be a part of the MYO family and to continue the work of guiding MYO's young tenor and bass voices as their voices develop.

Edward P. Norris III

Edward P. Norris III (Nassau Chamber Chorale) is the director of Choral Music at Glen Cove HS where he conducts the Mixed Chorus and the Select Chorale. Mr. Norris also teaches courses in Music Theory, and AP Music Theory. He serves as the music director and conductor of the school's musical productions, advisor of the Tri-M National Music Honors Society, and serves as the district's music team leader. During Mr. Norris' tenure at Glen Cove HS, the Mixed Chorus and Select Chorale have only received Gold Medals and Gold Medals with Distinction at the NYSSMA Major Ensemble festivals. In 2013, the Select Chorale was invited to perform at the White House for the President and First Lady, as well as other invited guests. In January of 2016, Mr. Norris and the Select Chorale performed in a concert tour of Italy, including the distinct honor to perform for His Holiness, Pope Francis, at the Feast of the Epiphany at St. Peters. In the spring of 2019, the Select Chorale had the honor of performing at the Music for All National Choral Festival in Indianapolis, Indiana. In February 2023, Mr. Norris' Select Chorale will be featured performers at the ACDA National Conference in Cincinnati Ohio. Mr. Norris is a graduate of the Aaron Copland School of Music at Queens College, where he received both his Bachelor of Arts Degree, and his Master's Degree in Music Education. Mr. Norris is extremely proud to be the director of the Nassau Chamber Chorale, and to have performed some of the world's finest choral literature in stunning performance settings. At Herricks HS, Louise teaches Treble Choir, Chamber Choir, and Mixed Chorus. Under Ms. O'Hanlon's directorship, Herricks Chamber Choir has consistently received ratings of Gold and Gold with Distinction for Level VI performance at NYSSMA. Chamber Choir has performed at the ACDA All Eastern Conference in 2012 and at the NYACDA Conference in October 2016. In March 2018 the Herricks Chamber Choir performed at the inaugural Music for All National Choral Festival and worked with composer and clinician, Dr. Rollo Dilworth. Professionally, Ms. O'Hanlon has been a guest conductor for several All-County festivals in Suffolk County. Ms. O'Hanlon's passion for Global Music has led to reading sessions at Westminster Choir College and a presentation at the Crane School of Music. In the fall of 2017, Ms. O'Hanlon presented Global Music workshops at the Balanced Mind Conference and the NYACDA Conference. As the conductor of Nassau Senior Treble Choir she loves to expose her students to a wide variety of ethnically diverse music. In addition to choral leadership, Ms. O'Hanlon is also a Health Coach, and a Yoga and Mindfulness teacher to both children and adults.

In May of 2022, her Select Chorale earned a "Gold" rating at the NYSSMA Major Organization Festival. Mrs. Melker has conducted several All-County and Area All-State choral festivals throughout New York State, the NMEA PEAK Festival Chorus, and has accompanied for many organizations in the New York Area including the NY-ACDA Elementary Honor Choir, Syracuse Children's Chorus, the SCMEA Division III West All-County Chorus and for several of Long Island's public school districts. She currently serves as the Mixed Chorus Chairperson for the NMEA Division V Vocal All-County Festival. Prior to joining the East Meadow faculty, Mrs. Melker spent five years as the Choral Director at Copiague MS, where she conducted four choral ensembles and directed several of the school's musical productions. During her tenure at Copiague, Mrs. Melker's Chamber Chorus performed annually at the NYSSMA Major Organization Festival where they received consistent "Gold" and "Gold with Distinction" ratings. Kaitlin has been with MYO since September 2013, serving as the piano accompanist for the Suffolk Treble Choir, and is now thrilled to be playing for the Nassau Treble Choir. She also served as the choir accompanist on the MYO tour to Italy this past summer alongside MYO conductor Louise O'Hanlon. Jeong-Hwa Park (Nassau Concert Choir) has been actively teaching and performing as a soloist and chamber musician in South Korea and the United States. Ms. Park holds Master of Arts and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees in piano performance from Arizona State University (ASU). She has won numerous awards including first prize in The Joseph and Ida Klatzkin Contemporary Solo Keyboard Music Competition and the ASU Piano Concerto Competition, and a Special Presentation Award from Artists International Presentations. Her concerto performance with the ASU Symphony Orchestra was broadcast on public radio, KBAQ, in Arizona. Her major performances include a New York debut recital at Weill Hall at Carnegie Hall, Old First Concert Series in San Francisco, Gammage Auditorium in Arizona, Museum of Arts in Arizona, London Piano Festival, and Master Works Festival at Houghton College, New York. In South Korea, she performed her solo recital at Dajeon Arts and Cultural Center, and a lecture recital at Buam Art Hall in Seoul. She also gave a performance at the College Music Society International Conference in Seoul as a collaborative pianist. As an accompanist, she performed for World Vision Korea Children's Choir and was invited to accompany the National Choir of Korea on tour, resulting in several concerts which were broadcast on Korean national television. Currently, Ms. Park is an adjunct faculty member at Nassau Community College; serves on the piano faculty at Center for Preparatory Studies in Music at Queens College and Brooklyn Conservatory of Music.

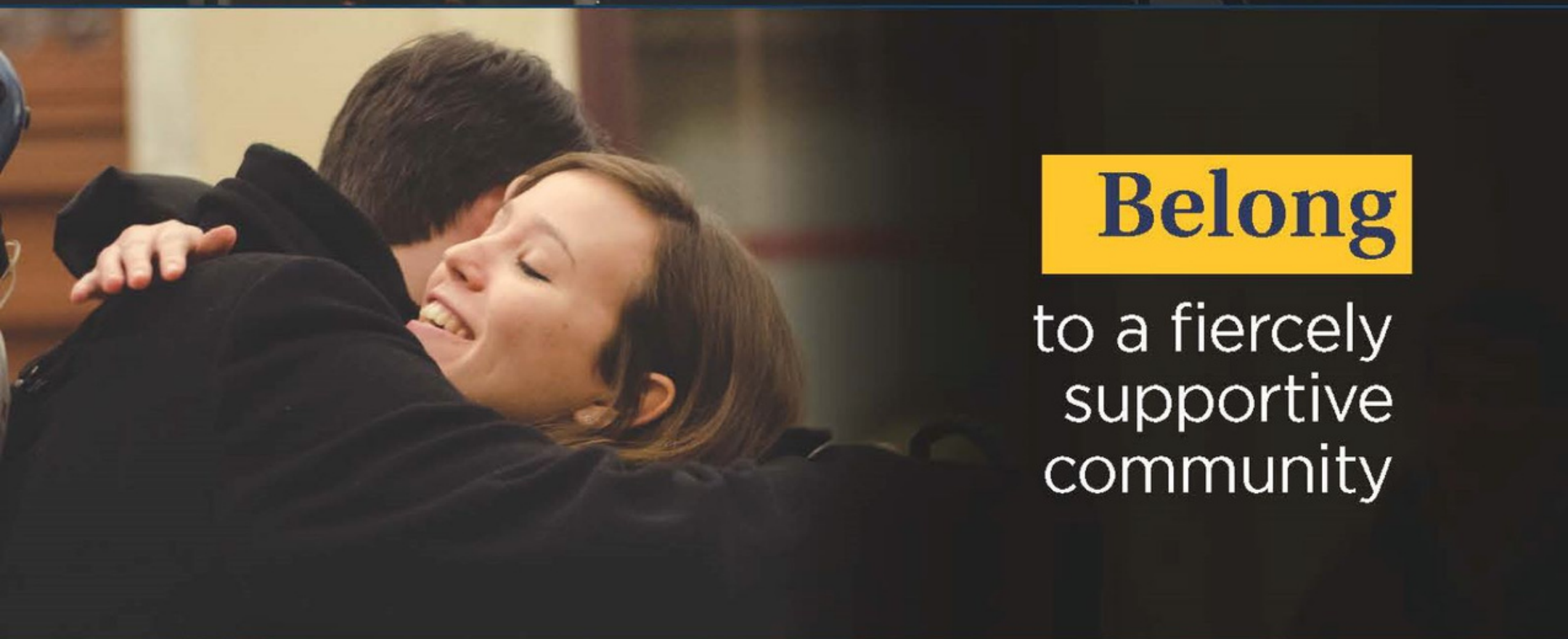

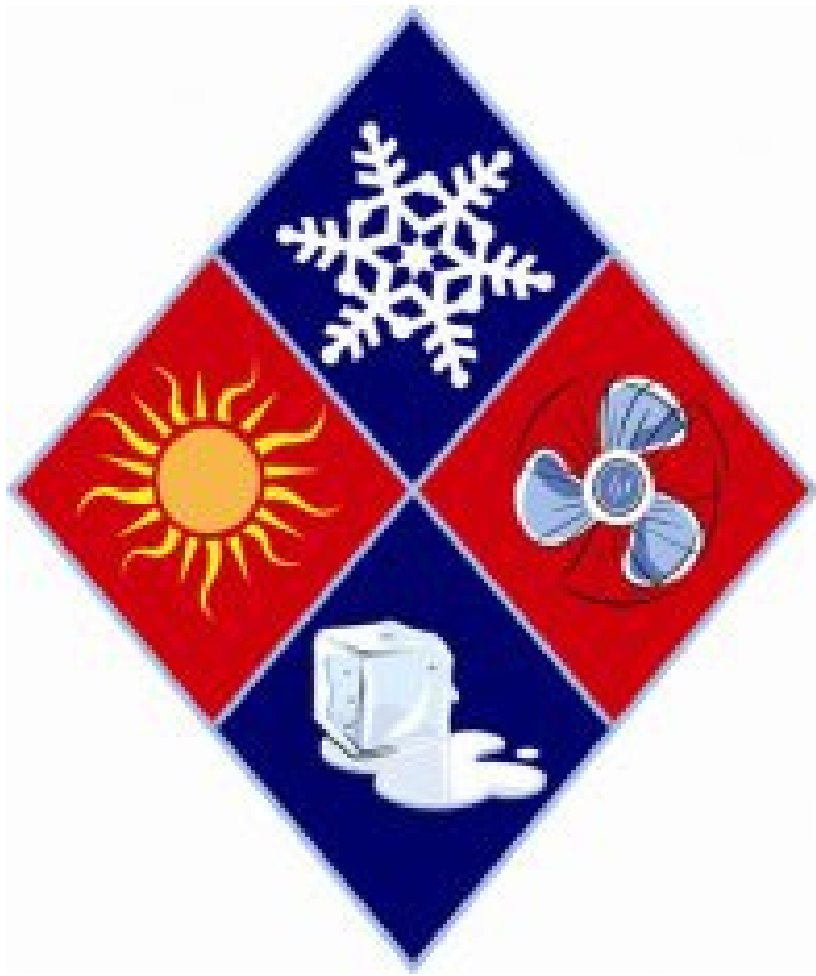

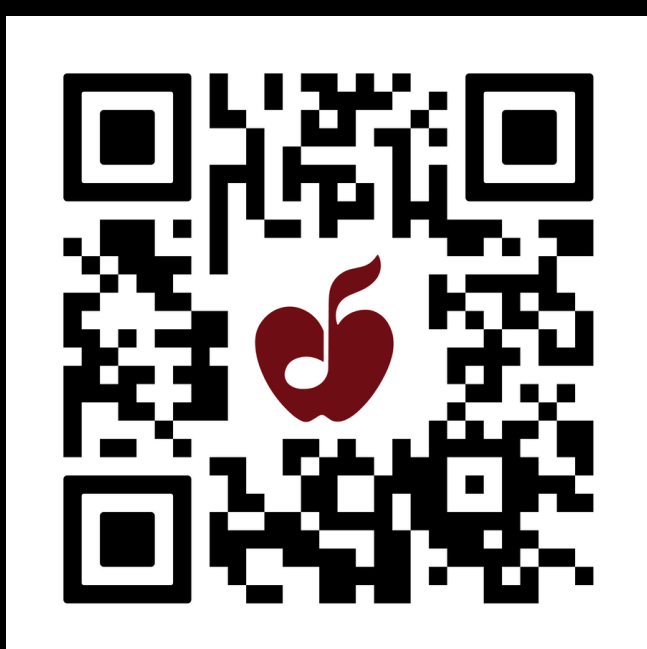
