Brad Drinkwater

Brad Drinkwater (Suffolk Symphonic Choir) has been teaching music, including 7th through 12th grade mixed and treble voice choirs, since 2005. He currently teaches choir and music theory at Connetquot High School in Bohemia, where he also directs the annual Alumni Choir. Brad served as the pianist for the MYO Suffolk Symphonic Choir from its inception in 2013 until his appointment as the inaugural director of the Suffolk Senior Treble Choir in 2019. He is delighted to be making music with the Suffolk Symphonic Choir once again, now as music director. Under his leadership, the Connetquot High School Concert Choir has appeared at American Choral Directors Association, New York State School Music Association, and New York State School Board Association conferences and won 2nd place in the 2020 American Prize national performing arts competition. Brad was also chosen as a semifinalist for the 2021 Grammy Music Educator Award. Additionally, Connetquot's annual Choral Arts Day event was selected by Music for All as an Advocacy in Action award recipient. Brad received his bachelor's degree in Music Education, with dual concentrations in voice and piano, from New York University and later earned a Master of Arts degree from Teachers College, Columbia University. At NYU, he studied with David Elliott, Francisco Nuñez, and Deirdre O'Donohue and served as the Assistant Director and pianist for the NYU Children's Choir. He was also recognized at the International Championship of Collegiate A Cappella for both arrangements and vocal performances. Brad enjoys working as a conductor, singer, and collaborative pianist, performing throughout Long Island—including as a member of the eVoco Voice Collective. Most importantly, he shares his love of music with his wife, Lauren, and their two sons.

Craig B. Knapp (Suffolk Treble Choir) is the current Elementary Music Department Chairperson in the Rocky Point School District where he has been teaching Classroom Music and Chorus, grades 3 through 5, at the Joseph A. Edgar Intermediate School since 1998. A graduate of the Crane School of Music, Mr. Knapp has also studied with distinguished educators and musicians including John Feierabend, Jos Wuytack, Henry Leck, Francisco Núñez, Janet Galván, Will Schmid and Bobby McFerrin. Craig is an Adjunct Assistant Professor at Hofstra University where he teaches "Conversational Solfege" and "First Steps in Music with Orff Schulwerk." He is the co-author of the book, *First Steps in Music with Orff Schulwerk: Sing, Say, Dance, Play* and a contributing author for the book, *Feierabend Fundamentals: History, Philosophy, and Practice*. Craig is a sought-after clinician and choral conductor and has guest conducted for the Connecticut Music Educators' Association Elementary Honors Choir, New Hampshire Music Educators' Association Elementary Honors Choir, Ohio Music Educators' Association Elementary All-State Choir, KONY (Kodály Organization of New York) "Voices United" Festival and Pennsylvania Music Educators' Association Elementary ChorusFest. He has also guest conducted various All-County chorus groups in New York State for the Dutchess, Monroe, Nassau, Orange, Putnam, Rockland, Schoharie, Suffolk, and Ulster County Music Educators' Associations. Craig is actively involved with NYSSMA (New York State School Music Association), where he recently served on their Curriculum Committee and NYSSMA Manual Committee. Craig is the only educator to simultaneously hold Lifetime Memberships in ACDA, FAME and OAKE.

Rachel Nagle (Suffolk Senior Treble Choir) began her career in 2007, teaching high school choir, and elementary music in the Commack School District. During this time, she also served as children's choir conductor through the Stony Brook Children's Program, and completed three levels of Orff certification at Hofstra University. She has since had the pleasure and experience of teaching all grades, K-12, and serving as a festival conductor in Suffolk and Nassau County. Rachel received her M.S. in Music Education from Queens College and her B.M. in Music Education with concentrations in voice and music in special education from the Crane School of Music at SUNY Potsdam. She has spent twelve years as Elwood-John Glenn High School's Choral Director, where she cultivated a rich musical community within her classroom, and established the select a cappella ensemble "Acappellwood." In addition to her choirs there, she has been the director and vocal director of several musical theater productions. She is currently teaching elementary music and beginning choirs, as well as secondary vocal lessons in the Elwood School District. Rachel assisted in developing and directing the a cappella group established through Long Island Children's Choir (LICC) alongside her husband, James, and continues to create accessible a cappella arrangements for contemporary ensembles. In addition to her teaching, she enjoys performing as a soprano in eVoco Voice Collective's Treble Ensemble. She currently resides in Stony Brook, NY with her husband and their two sons.

Phil Preddice (Suffolk Principal Orchestra) is a graduate of the Crane School of Music at SUNY Potsdam where he studied viola with Lamar Alsop, Theodore Israel, and Maurice Baritaud. His voice instruction was taught by Richard Griffith and Brock McElheran, and his conducting studies were carefully guided by Brock McElheran. Performances under the batons of Eugene Ormandy, Stanley Chappel, Christopher Keene, and Aaron Copland inspired Mr. Preddice to reach for new heights as a conductor. He has been the conductor of the Suffolk Principal Orchestra since its formation in 2008. Mr. Preddice is the founding and Principal Conductor of the Crane Alumni Festival Orchestra. This ensemble, founded in 2014, performs concerts to raise scholarship funds for students wishing to pursue advanced music studies at the Crane. Mr. Preddice is a composer, with several works premiered by the MYO Suffolk Principal Orchestra. Mr. Preddice is a past President of SCMEA, has held executive Board Positions with the LISFA, and the New York State ASTA. He is currently retired from a career as Orchestra director in the Commack, Shoreham-Wading River, and Three Village school districts. Mr. Preddice is the recipient of the 2000 Helen Hosmer Excellence in Music Teaching Award, granted by the Alumni Association of Crane. Music is always being played in the Preddice household. Wife Susan, daughter Alisa, son Jon, and daughter Leanne are all music teachers and active local musicians. Susan and Phil have 10 grandchildren, all of whom play the violin, viola, or cello. The Preddice Family String Quartet plays for brides and grooms throughout Long Island and the Metropolitan NYC area. Felicya Schwarzman (Suffolk String Orchestra) is the Orchestra and Guitar Director at Half Hollow Hills HS East. While a teacher in HHH, she founded the 3rd grade string program, the HS East Guitar Program, and Cello Choir. She conducts the HHH Cross Campus Chamber Orchestra, a select NYSSMA Level 6 ensemble. In 2021, she received the SCMEA Music Educator Innovator Award, and her Guitar Ensemble was recognized in the Long Island Music Hall of Fame High School Recognition program. Her award-winning Guitar Ensemble has performed as a selected ensemble at the NYSSMA All State and NaFME All-Eastern Music Conferences. Felicya holds a Bachelor of Music Education from Ithaca College and a Master of Music Education with an Advanced Certificate in Bilingual/Bicultural Education from Teachers College, Columbia University. Felicya is the President of ASTA NY Chapter where she helped found the annual NY-ASTA CelloFest and Alternative Strings Day. Her experiences as a clinician include the SCMEA All County Festival, NYSSMA Summer & Winter Conferences, and Universidad Sergio Arboleda. In these workshops, she discussed her passion for non-traditional methods of playing the cello and how to develop contemporary ensembles in public schools. She also serves her local community as a SCMEA Festival Chairperson. As a professional cellist and violinist, she performed in the South Shore Symphony. In addition, she has adjudicated and coached the NY All State Symphony Orchestra Cello Section. She most recently played violin on the MYO Italy Tour. Felicya is a proud alumna of MYO; she joined MYO as a violinist in 2007 and then as a cellist a year later. She started working as the MYO Summer Intern during college, then as the Cello Coach for Nassau Orchestras, and is thrilled to continue working with MYO's talented musicians.

Scott Zarchy (Suffolk Symphony Orchestra) is a music educator, cellist, and composer. Mr. Zarchy received undergraduate degrees in Cello Performance and Music Education from the Peabody Conservatory, where he also completed studies in composition. He received a Master of Music degree in Music Education from Boston University and a Master of Arts in Music Composition from Hunter College (CUNY). Mr. Zarchy studied the cello at Peabody with the late Mihaly Virizlay, 40-year Principal Cellist of the Baltimore Symphony, and Alan Stepansky, former Associate Principal of the New York Philharmonic. Mr. Zarchy also performed in master classes with cellists including Alisa Weilerstein, Natasha Brofsky, and Amit Peled. Mr. Zarchy was the founding conductor of the MYO Suffolk Concert Orchestra from its inception in 2009 until 2013, at which time he became the founding conductor of the Suffolk Symphony Orchestra. Mr. Zarchy has been the orchestra teacher, as well as pit orchestra and chamber orchestra director, at Patchogue-Medford High School since 2006, where his ensembles have regularly achieved NYSSMA Level VI Gold and Gold with Distinction ratings. Mr. Zarchy's public school conducting has spanned a wide range of genres, including extensive musical theater work, film music, combined choral/instrumental works and jazz, as well as more traditional classical repertoire. Mr. Zarchy is an active member of the Long Island music education community and, in 2020, served as guest conductor of the Nassau All-County Division III Orchestra. He is also a former executive board member of LISFA.
