Brad Drinkwater (Suffolk Symphonic Choir) has been teaching music, including 7th through 12th grade mixed and treble voice choirs, since 2005. He currently teaches choir and music theory at Connetquot High School in Bohemia, where he also directs the annual Alumni Choir. Brad served as the pianist for the MYO Suffolk Symphonic Choir from its inception in 2013 until his appointment as the inaugural director of the Suffolk Senior Treble Choir in 2019. He is delighted to be making music with the Suffolk Symphonic Choir once again, now as music director. Under his leadership, the Connetquot High School Concert Choir has appeared at American Choral Directors Association, New York State School Music Association, and New York State School Board Association conferences and won 2nd place in the 2020 American Prize national performing arts competition. Brad was also chosen as a semifinalist for the 2021 Grammy Music Educator Award. Additionally, Connetquot's annual Choral Arts Day event was selected by Music for All as an Advocacy in Action award recipient. Brad received his bachelor's degree in music education, with dual concentrations in voice and piano, from New York University and later earned a Master of Arts degree from Teachers College, Columbia University. At NYU, he studied with David Elliott, Francisco Nuñez, and Deirdre O'Donohue and served as the Assistant Director and pianist for the NYU Children's Choir. He was also recognized at the International Championship of Collegiate A Cappella for both arrangements and vocal performances. Brad enjoys working as a conductor, singer, and collaborative pianist, performing throughout Long Island. Most importantly, he shares his love of music with his wife, Lauren, and their two sons.

Craig B. Knapp (Suffolk Treble Choir) is the current Elementary Music Department Chairperson in the Rocky Point School District where he has been teaching Classroom Music and Chorus, grades 3 through 5, at the Joseph A. Edgar Intermediate School since 1998. A graduate of the Crane School of Music, Mr. Knapp has also studied with distinguished educators and musicians including John Feierabend, Jos Wuytack, Henry Leck, Francisco Núñez, Janet Galván, Will Schmid and Bobby McFerrin. He is the co-author of the book "First Steps in Music with Orff Schulwerk: Sing, Say, Dance, Play," a contributing author for the book "Feierabend Fundamentals: History, Philosophy, and Practice," and co-author of the soon to be released book, *Conversational Solfege with Orff Schulwerk: Sing, Say, Dance, Play in a Tuneful, Beatful, Artful Way*, all published by GIA Publications. Craig is a sought-after clinician and choral conductor and has guest conducted for the Connecticut Music Educators' Association Elementary Honors Choir, New Hampshire Music Educators' Association Elementary Honors Choir, Ohio Music Educators' Association Elementary All-State Choir, KONY (Kodály Organization of New York) "Voices United" Festival and Pennsylvania Music Educators' Association Elementary ChorusFest. He has also guest conducted various All-County chorus groups across New York State. Craig is actively involved with NYSSMA, where he recently served on their Curriculum Committee and NYSSMA Manual Committee. Craig is the only educator to simultaneously hold Lifetime Memberships in ACDA, FAME and OAKE. On February 1, 2025, Craig Knapp was inducted in the Long Island Music & Entertainment Hall of Fame as their 2024 Educator of Note.

Rachel Nagle (Suffolk Senior Treble Choir) began her career in 2007, teaching high school choir, and elementary music in the Commack School District. During this time, she also served as children's choir conductor through the Stony Brook Children's Program, and completed three levels of Orff certification at Hofstra University. She has since had the pleasure and experience of teaching all grades, K-12, and serving as a festival conductor in Suffolk and Nassau County. Rachel received her M.S. in Music Education from Queens College and her B.M. in Music Education with concentrations in voice and music in special education from the Crane School of Music at SUNY Potsdam. She has spent twelve years as Elwood-John Glenn High School's Choral Director, where she cultivated a rich musical community within her classroom, and established the select a cappella ensemble "Acappelwood." In addition to her choirs there, she has been the director and vocal director of several musical theater productions. She is currently teaching elementary music and beginning choirs, as well as secondary vocal lessons in the Elwood School District. Rachel assisted in developing and directing the a cappella group established through Long Island Children's Choir (LICC) alongside her husband, James, and continues to create accessible a cappella arrangements for contemporary ensembles. In addition to her teaching, she enjoys performing as a soprano in eVoco Voice Collective's Treble Ensemble. She currently resides in Stony Brook, NY with her husband and their two sons.

Teaching and coaching solo musicians since 1997, she has prepared and/or accompanied many singers and instrumentalists for NYSSMA festivals, college entrance auditions, competitions, and collegiate-level juries and recitals. Prior to teaching full-time, Ms. Dobie worked at professional theaters across the country as a musical director, director, and choreographer. She also spent many years developing and running youth theater programs for ages 5-18.

Joseph Franzino (Suffolk Symphonic Choir) holds a Bachelor of Music degree in Piano Performance and a Master of Science degree in Music Education from the Aaron Copland School of Music at Queens College. While at Queens College, he studied piano under the guidance of Morey Ritt and voice with Sidney Outlaw. Throughout his academic career, Mr. Franzino performed extensively in solo recitals, chamber music ensembles, and frequently served as a collaborative pianist. He is a recipient of the Aaron Copland School of Music Concerto Competition, through which he was selected to perform Edvard Grieg's Piano Concerto in A minor. In his final year at Queens College, he served as the NYSSMA-NAfME Collegiate President for the State of New York. Mr. Franzino is currently a music educator in the Farmingdale School District, where he teaches Music Theory I, AP Music Theory, and directs the Treble Chorus. He also serves as the pianist for the Farmingdale High School Mixed Chorus, accompanies NYSSMA solo festivals, and supports Tri-M senior recitals. Additionally, he has vocal directed musicals for Howitt Middle School and serves as the director of the FHS Vocal Jazz ensemble. Outside of his public school responsibilities, Mr. Franzino maintains a private piano studio.

Mr. Nagle also provides vocal direction and accompaniment for his school's musical productions and vocal jazz ensemble. He has been honored to conduct All-County Choirs for SCMEA and OCMEA at the elementary, middle, and high school levels. In addition to teaching, Mr. Nagle is an accomplished pianist having played at numerous festivals and performances throughout the northeast. He has accompanied several SCMEA, NMEA, and NYSCAME All-County Choirs and currently serves as a collaborative pianist for the MYO's Suffolk Senior Treble Choir. Mr. Nagle received a Bachelor of Music degree in Music Education from the Crane School of Music at SUNY Potsdam in 2007. At Crane, he studied with Rebecca Reames, Heather Eyerly, and Adam Adler and was honored with the Susan Smykla Udell Award for Outstanding Piano Accompaniment before graduation. He served as the President and Music Director of the Potsdam Pointercounts, an award-winning a cappella group. During that time, he developed his arranging style and love of performing contemporary a cappella music as the group successfully competed and toured throughout the East Coast. Mr. Nagle attained a Master of Science degree in Music Education from the Aaron Copland School of Music at CUNY Queens in 2011, where he received the Lawrence Eisman Award in Music Education. Outside of music, Mr. Nagle enjoys playing basketball, swimming, kayaking, and going on adventures with his wife and two sons.

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
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
